DISTRICT 6 CONVENTION JUNE 25-28, 2008

Fjellheim Lodge strikes gold in California!!! There still is gold in them thar hills as your delegates to the District 6 Convention discovered. Our lodge was presented with a Special Recognition Gold Merit Award for 2006 and another Gold Merit Award for 2007. Even as we delegates were celebrating, Fjellheim Lodge was awarded the Lodge of the Year Plaque (large lodge category) for 2006. Recognition such as this is achieved only by the hard work of all our membership and we lucky delegates wished that all the members could have been there to enjoy the recognition. I would be remiss if I did not thank Jill Johnson for her hard work during her tenure as President.

Your delegates, Agnes Barilovich, Mechelle Berge, Sissel Disbrow, Dorothy Hanson, Char Knutson, Bjorg Mapstone, and Inger Pappas traveled by plane, train and automobile to San Ramon, California to attend the District 6 2008 Convention. We had great accommodations and meeting facilities and a very enthusiastic group of fellow delegates. The host lodge, Bjornson # 14 from Oakland, did an outstanding job.

Our meetings started bright and early on Thursday with the Pledge of Allegiance, anthems, greetings, introductions and roll call and so on throughout the next two days. We had a very moving Memorial Service, a presentation about Camp Norge and the Heritage Camp, a Foundation Walk-a thon, and Elections.

The delegates were presented with three proposed resolutions asking for changes to our District By-Laws. It was proposed that we lower the number of delegates sent from each lodge, depending on the number of members. This resolution was defeated and we will continue to use the current rules. The second resolution concerned the number of members on the Recreation Center Board of Directors. It was accepted and one position will be eliminated. The last resolution concerned District dues. It was proposed that due to increase in the cost of doing business, the decline in "paying" membership, cost cutting effort not being enough, etc. that our District dues be increased by \$5.00 per member. As you can imagine there was a lot of discussion on this topic. The result was that the resolution passed and the increase will be effective starting in January 2009.

The election of District 6 Board members was on Saturday. The following is a list of our District 6 Board: President- Janie Kelly, Vice President- Lyle Berge, Treasurer- Roger Espeland, Secretary- Carol Lee Solheim, Public Relations Officer- Wendy Kay Winkelman, Zone 8 Director- Diane Molter. We wish them all the best in the next two years. Please give them your support, they work for our benefit!

We also elected International Convention delegates. Zone 8 will be represented by Sissel Disbrow from Fjellheim, John Neverdahl from Trollheim, Barbara Robb from Fjellaldalen, and Diane Molter, our Zone Director. The convention wasn't all business. We enjoyed a fair share of socializing and I think we all came home with pride in our organization and renewed energy to move forward.

5. Walk-A-Thon Donations to the Foundation: \$4,394.75 (this was collected at the convention) District 6 collected the most of all the other districts in Sons of Norway!
6. Resolution 1: "Be it therefore resolved that in order to enable the District 6 Treasury to remain solvent and be able to meet its' annual budget to cover the increasing costs, that the annual member dues be increased by \$5.00 to be effective Jan 1, 2009" - Resolution was passed 118 to 55
7. Resolution 2: "The Board of Directors shall be composed of 9 persons (instead of 10), one of whom shall be the District President or his/her designee from the District 6 Board, all of whom shall at all times be members of District No. 6 Sons of Norway. At least two members of the Board will represent lodges in Southern California and two members of the Board will represent Utah, Colorado, Arizona and Nevada. In the event that there are no available candidates from Southern California or from Utah, Colorado, Arizona and Nevada, the vacancies shall be filled from the District 6 membership at large." - Resolution Passed
8. Resolution 3: By-Law change, Article V, Paragraph 10 - current, "Every lodge within the District shall be entitled to two delegates for the lodge and one for every fifty members or major fraction thereof..." - proposed, "Every lodge with the District shall be entitled to two delegates for the lodge and one for every one hundred members or major fraction thereof..." - Resolution Defeated.

WINS GOLD IN MATH**

A 19-year-old math prodigy from Norway won top honors over the weekend in the International Mathematical Olympiad (IMO) in Madrid.

Jørgen Vold Rennemo had participated twice before in the IMO, which ranks as the World Championship Mathematics Competition for High School students. He won silver, but was keen on winning the gold.

Rennemo managed to solve five of six assignments, winning 35 out of 42 points. He grabbed the gold medal by a four-point margin.
