**DISTRICT 6 SCHOLARSHIPS  
DISTRIKT 6 STIPEND**

The 6<sup>th</sup> District will award three \$1,000.00 scholarships to members in good standing, their children or grandchildren who are Unge Venner members in any lodge in the 6<sup>th</sup> District. They must attend an accredited college or university in the USA as a fulltime undergraduate in their sophomore, junior or senior year and have a grade point average of 2.5 or better on a scale wherein A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1 and F=0. These scholarships can also be awarded to those students in their sophomore, junior or senior year of any accredited four-year program at a community college in the USA. When an applicant is deemed worthy of a scholarship (recommended by the 6<sup>th</sup> District Scholarship Committee and approved by the 6<sup>th</sup> District Board) the funds will be paid directly to the student.

## **SONS OF NORWAY FOUNDATION *SONS OF NORWAY STIFTELSEN***

2007 has seen another successful scholarship and grant season. We are continually amazed at the number of qualified students applying for Sons of Norway Foundation scholarships. We have funded 27 scholarships for \$68,350, plus Draxten Fund camp monies to the Districts for an additional \$10,768, \$79,118 in total.

We have awarded 70 grants to our lodges and their communities for \$30,435 in 2007. We continue to see more Helping Hands to Children grants for Adopt A School and Barnas Norsk Klubb programs. This interest in youth will ripple throughout S/N and build a promising future for our organization. Local Lodge Partnership Grants are also climbing due to the community and lodge cultural programs being creatively presented around the country. Marketing S/N in this manner will lead to more involved members.

Clara Evenson, a long time member of Kringen Lodge in Fargo, ND, left a bequest in her will to the Sons of Norway Foundation that will provide new scholarship opportunities for the S/N youth in District Four to attend Norwegian heritage camps. This will be effective for the 2008 scholarship season. Guidelines are in the works.

Here is quick update on the Board Goals for the Foundation for 2006-2008.

- a) 31% of lodges gave donations to the Foundation in 2006  
Goal is 25%, with 10% increase annually.
- b) Less than 1% of individual members gave to the Foundation in 2006.  
Goal is 25% of individual members giving annually.
- c) \$79,604 was received in non-legacy gifts in 2006, (gifts of \$5,000 or more).  
Goal is \$175,000 by July of 2008
- d) Total assets of Foundation as of 12/31/06, \$4,285,271  
Goal is \$5,000,000 by July of 2008.

What is your lodge and District doing to achieve these goals? You may host a Foundation Month Fundraiser in your lodge, participate in the Coin A Day program for individuals, or hold a silent auction. Send me an e-mail for suggestions on how you can help us grow our Foundation so we are able to expand the scholarship and grant opportunities available to our members and to meet our goals.

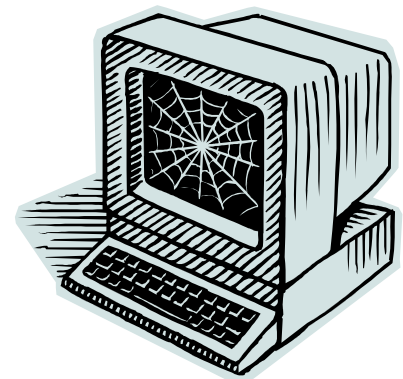
As you hopefully have noticed already, we have our new website up and running. Thank you to Rory Foresman and Terry Mapstone for getting this up and running for us.

**FORTY SIXTH  
ROSEMALING SEMINAR AT CAMP NORGE  
SEPTEMBER 22/23, 2007**

It is time to make your reservations for the fall Rosemaling Seminar at Camp Norge. Again, we will have three classes. The teachers are Julie Anne Droivold, Mardella Ivers and Kay White. We will be using the firehouse for classes.

We will be painting on a 10 inch round clock (about a 3" clock in center and wood band around it) Julie Anne is teaching a Telemark Rose design on a medium blue background, Kay is teaching a Rogaland style with tulips and bonnet flowers on a light green background. Mardella is teaching a Rogaland style on a burgundy background for the beginning class. Look on the Camp Norge Website in a week or so for pictures of all three projects:

Please make your room reservation with me. I keep the list of who is in which room. You will pay the Hostess for your room when you arrive at Camp. It is not included in your class fee. Bring your current membership card. Members pay \$15 per night; guests pay \$18 for dorms. Only members are allowed to stay in the main house and the cozy cabins. For people who want to room together, I need to receive the list of names with the first reservation. RV's are encouraged as we have a limited number of beds. Members pay \$20 per night for up to four people per RV. Guests pay \$25 per night for RV's. We have electrical and water, but no sewer hookups. Tents are \$15 for up to four people for members, \$18 for non. Pets are \$2 per night. Pets are not allowed in any of the buildings, pool area or sleeping rooms at any time.

Please include your full phone number, address and lodge name and number when registering. If you have e-mail, please enclose your e-mail address. It is so much faster and cheaper if I need to talk to you. As soon as the supply lists are available from the teachers, I will send them as I receive your registration form and check. **ABSOLUTELY NO E-MAIL RESERVATION REQUESTS.** I need the check and registration form. Be sure to send a self addressed stamped envelope for your supply list and class confirmation information if you do not have e-mail. *I will not be sending you a supply list unless you send me a self-addressed, stamped envelope or your e-mail address with your registration form.* I use Microsoft Word running on an XP program and all attachments will be attached from that program.

The cost of the seminar will be \$78 for registration which includes the class and wood piece all base coated and ready to go, the fire hall clean up and the meals. There will be \$25 cancellation fee, but absolutely no cancellations after September 1. Class registration fees can be refunded if you have to cancel up to September 1 if there is someone on the waiting list who wants your space. It is difficult for people on the waiting list to take your place if they do not have at least three weeks to make their plans. Debbie Dawson will again do our cooking. The cost for food for the weekend is included in the \$78 registration fee. The food includes breakfast, lunch and dinner on Saturday and breakfast and lunch on Sunday. You were so very generous and cooperative with the cookies last time. I do so appreciate that. We will ask just one class to bring cookies, and will rotate those classes each time. The information will be in your supply list letter.

## IN MEMORIAM VI MINNES

### KEN KOLSTAD



Ken touched many lives by his energy, exuberance, and integrity in many and varied pursuits. After knocking around in a few jobs during the depression, Ken enrolled in Northeastern University, a work/study college in Boston, MA, never missing the Deans List. Only a few weeks after being married, he served in England in the time between the two London blitzes. During World War II he was a technician for Sperry bombsights and taught Lindbergh their use. Honorably discharged from the Army as being too old at 30, then came teaching and establishing an electrical consulting firm in Alfered, NY. With his wife and 5 children (Mid, Dave, Andy, Ralph, and Marge), he moved to Colorado Springs and became the first consulting electrical engineer in the community.

Ken wrote a book that greatly shortened the process for a contractor to prepare an estimate titled Rapid Electrical Estimating and Pricing published by McGraw-Hill in 1969. Later joined by his business partner, Gerry Kohnert, they completed 4 more editions before computers replaced it shortly before his retirement in 1980.

Both he and Mid had a real heart for aviation in upstate NY where they became friends with many of the sports early designers and enthusiasts. Together they helped form the first soaring club in Colorado with David C. Johnson. Most of their children also got the aviation bug and in 1968, they established the Paul Kolstad Memorial Fund to honor their record making son who lost his life while flying at age 15 in 1966. That fund has provided scholarships for more than 50 recipients, with money from Paul's college fund, donations, and chicken barbeques (using a special barbeque recipe from Cornell University where Ken worked for a time).

After retiring, Ken developed his life long interest in cooking, always giving away cookies, bread, and having pizza parties.

He and Mid enjoyed traveling the country with Elderhostel, Ports of Call and visiting family to add to their genealogical research. They both delivered Meals on Wheels for so many years that they were slow to realize that all of their recipients were younger than they were! Then enjoyed an active membership in the Sons of Norway Lodge.

His final volunteer activity was PILLAR, where he also found many friends. Mid entered the database and Ken maintained thousands of names and addresses.

Typical of his attitude toward life, his four-year goal at that time was to "live to be a hundred." So, unfortunately in his mind, his life was cut short. He loved positive thinking! Ken's spark of life, his enthusiasm for the best in people, and his love for his friends-- including those not yet met--will long remain an inspiration to all of us.

We will be having a memorial service for him on August 11 at 2:00 PM. We will pass out bow ties to anyone who would like to wear one and we will be giving out loaves of bread at the end and there will be coffee/tea and cookies for people afterward.

### GLADYS L. (OVERLIN) ZOELLNER

Gladys L. Zoellner (Overlin) formerly of Colorado Springs and Elizabeth, Colorado. She was born Dec. 24, 1917 in Lake Mills, IA, and passed away May 30, 2007 in Ft. Morgan, CO. She was preceded in death by her beloved husband Adolf Zoellner and by her second husband Walter Overlin. She is survived by her children Jerry (Allyson) of Foxfield, Jay (Janine) of Walkerton, IN, Jack (Susan) of Castle Rock, Jean Kernodle (Jimmy) of Ft. Morgan; sisters Violet Doda of Crookston, MN, June Dale and brother James Olson of Fertile, MN; eight grandchildren, cousins, and other relatives and many, many friends.

Gladys was an RN and served in the Army during WWII as a nurse in the South Pacific. She met Adolf, a disabled veteran, while he was recovering in the hospital. After the war, they moved to Colorado Springs, where she continued part-time in the nursing profession while raising a family. She was active in the church, garden club, loved traveling throughout the US, and later enjoyed arts and crafts. Gladys will always be remembered for her boundless energy, positive attitude and infectious laugh. Contributions may be made to the Disabled American Veterans. The visitation and service were followed by entombment at the Shrine of Remembrance Mausoleum, 1730 E. Fountain Blvd.

Glad was very active in the early days of our Lodge, participating in bake sales, picnics, and other lodge activities. She had a sparkling personality that cheered those around her. After she moved to Elizabeth, Colorado she made it a point for many years afterward to attend the Lutefisk Dinner and she always bought some lutefisk and lefse to take with her to keep traditions alive in her family and circle of friends. We remember her with gratitude and with joy in our hearts.
